#### What to Bring:

Each scout should carry **WATER** & Drink the water, and wear a bandana or hat during entire weekend Each competeing patrol needs: COFFIN for racing, pocket knife, patrol flag, and *plenty of Scout Spirit*.

Each <u>Troop</u> needs: Makeup, costumes, etc. for zombifying your leader and for Zombie theater. Other Zombie essentials needed will be emailed/announced at April Roundtable

#### **General Information:**

Participation: This is a GREAT recruiting event. Webelos must register with a Troop, and must bring a parent or

guardian with them. ALL Scouts are expected to participate in either the Backcountry program, the

Patrol Competition, or help staff the Patrol Competition activity their Troop is sponsoring.

**BSA Required Info:** All Participants, Youth and Adult – Current dated Health Form

Troops – Tour Permit Completed & Filed with Council Office

Conduct: All scouts shall live and act by the Scout Oath and Law, Outdoor Code. Scouts are requested to stay

near the front-country area at all times. No wandering off to explore Camp.

Leadership: At least two adults must be in camp with each unit at all times (camping area). Scouts may

participate in Patrol events without adult leaders following.

Parking: No vehicles will be allowed to park in campsite areas. Vehicles will be restricted to the designated

Parking Areas. Only Trailers will be allowed to stay near the camping area. Upon arrival, you will be directed to your camping area for drop-off, then you will be asked to move your vehicle to the

designated parking areas away from your campsite.

Campsites: Campsites will be pre-assigned according to the arrival of registration forms and payment at the

Council office. Sign up early to assist the staff. Please respect the campsites of all the Units

attending. There will be multiple units sharing designated campsite areas.

Fire: No individual campfires.

Water: Each Troop monitoring a Patrol Station shall provide drinking water in a cooler; however, everybody

should carry a personal container and enough water to drink a liter during each 2-hour session.

Latrines: The camp latrines will be used and kept clean at all times. Observe signs which will indicate

restrictions on latrine use by scouts, adults, women and staff. Some toilet paper will be provided, but each unit should be prepared and bring their own, as well as their own soap and towels for

washing/drying their hands.

Lighting: No open or flame-type lanterns or fires inside or near any tents. Adult leaders shall handle all fuel

usage. All fuel storage shall be away from all tents. Only battery powered lighting is allowed inside

tents.

Clean-up: All units are responsible for policing their assigned areas before check-out. Each unit will be required

to supply 2 scouts on Sunday morning, after the morning activities to clean the latrines <u>before</u> final check is allowed. Send representatives to Pavilion for check-out procedure. **There are no garbage** 

**facilities** – all garbage must be packed out.

**Environment:** We are camping at an environmentally sensitive area. Please treat it accordingly. Beware of cactus

and other sharp plants, barbed wire, SNAKES, chupacapra etc, especially when walking around at

night.

**Visitor:** Parents or other visitors are most welcome, especially at the Saturday night campfire.

Special Needs: Please inform the registrar of all special needs (handicap, etc.) for anyone attending DAW.
