## Know the Rules

If your pack is planning to participate in the district Pinewood Derby® Saturday May 20, 2017, your Pinewood Derby® committee needs to make sure that their rules don't conflict with those of the district in order to ensure their members can participate at this level.

### Pinewood Derby® Rules

Each local Pinewood Derby® committee will determine rules for building and racing its pack's Pinewood Derby® cars.

Here are the rules that will be used at the district event. They have been taken from the BSA's Cub Scout Leader How-To Book:

Width shall not exceed 2-3/4 inches.

Length shall not exceed 7 inches.

Weight shall not exceed 5 ounces.

Axles, wheels, and body shall be from the materials provided in the kit.

Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited.

No lubricating oil may be used. Axles may be lubricated with powdered graphite or silicone.

The car shall not ride on any kind of spring.

The car must be free-wheeling, with no starting devices.

No loose materials of any kind are allowed in the car.

Once the final weigh-in has occurred no alterations may be made

Repairs to the cars will be made by the Derby "Pit Crew," unless otherwise directed
