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# New Cub Program Requirements

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- **Effective Immediately (11/30/16)**
- **Focus = make program more flexible for busy parents & Den leaders**
- **Ensure that adventure req's achievable within a program year**
- **Some adventure req's now optional - giving control to Dens**



# New Cub Program Requirements

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- **Huge array of options**
- **Should be able to complete 1 adventure in approx. 2 den meetings**
- **Can use revised req's immediately**
- **No new materials, free addendum online**



# Example – Previous (Tiger)

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## *Backyard Jungle Adventure Requirements*

1. Take a 1-foot hike. Make a list of the living things you find on your 1-foot hike
2. Point out two different kinds of birds that live in your area.
3. Be helpful to plants and animals by planting a tree or other plant in your neighborhood
4. Build and hang a birdhouse
5. With your adult partner, go for a walk, and pick out two sounds you hear in your “jungle”



# Example – Now (Tiger)

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## ***Complete Req. 1 plus at least two others***

- 1. Take a 1-foot hike. Make a list of the living things you find on your 1-foot hike**
- 2. Point out two different kinds of birds that live in your area.**
- 3. Be helpful to plants and animals by planting a tree or other plant in your neighborhood**
- 4. Build and hang a birdhouse**
- 5. With your adult partner, go for a walk, and pick out two sounds you hear in your “jungle”**



# Example – Previous (Wolf)

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## *Adventures in Coins Requirements*

1. Identify different parts of a coin
2. Find the mint mark on a coin; identify what mint facility it was made in and what year it was made
3. Play a coin game
4. Choose a coin that interests you, and make a coin rubbing. List information next to the coin detailing the pictures on it, the year it was made, and the mint where it was made
5. Play a game or create a game board with your den or family where you can practice adding and subtracting coins
6. Create a balance scale
7. Do a coin-weight investigation

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## ***Complete Reqs 1-4 & any other(s) of your choice***

1. Identify different parts of a coin
2. Find the mint mark on a coin; identify what mint facility it was made in and what year it was made
3. Play a coin game
4. Choose a coin that interests you, and make a coin rubbing. List information next to the coin detailing the pictures on it, the year it was made, and the mint where it was made
5. Play a game or create a game board with your den or family where you can practice adding and subtracting coins
6. Create a balance scale
7. Do a coin-weight investigation
